Distinguished Guests, the Manehoua Family, Ladies and Gentleman.

As has already been mentioned I am representing the Province of Oceania of the Congregation of the Mission – the Vincentian Fathers & Brothers – and have come to the Solomon Islands offer our sincere thanks to so many people.

Our first prayer of thanksgiving is of course to Almighty God who has led Vincent on this journey to ordination which has given us all the opportunity to celebrate the wonderful liturgy of ordination this morning and join this celebration this afternoon.

I thank Bishop John Dvaninoel SM, the ordaining prelate, whose first ordination to the priesthood is of course Vincent Manehoua CM.
