On the 25th of November, 2017, we celebrated the feast day of our Lady of Miraculous Medal. In the past six years, the Sacred Heart Parish in Mount Druitt, NSW under the leadership of Father Carl Ashton welcomed and continuously supported our members in this celebration. It's amazing how the local parishioners embraced and became an integral part of the yearly celebration. The feast begun with the Holy Mass officiated by Father Ashton, followed by the prayer of the rosary and short procession with the image of Our Lady of Miraculous Medal around the church block. While this year's celebration was not as well attended as the previous years, it was remarkable how these loosely organised members shared their ever growing bond with the Lady of Miraculous Medal and among themselves.

Our journey with the Blessed Virgin Mary....

Home visits with the image of the Miraculous Medal remain the main activity of the group. It was during these visits that members experienced the intercession of Our Lady of Miraculous Medal in their healing, comfort and renewed strength, growth in faith and deeper understanding of the love of God. A mother who was visited by the image of the Miraculous Medal for the first time in January 2017 shared miraculous healing. The aggressive tumour in her brain stopped growing immediately after the visit and the doctors' prognosis of her condition dramatically improved since then. An older lady shared how praying the rosary with the Miraculous Medal provided her comfort from her deep sadness due to her husband's passing. There were many stories of answered prayers for finding job, family reconciliation and peace among members. We have witnessed renewed strength from our seriously ill members, even peaceful passing of members or their loved ones. While there is no deliberate effort to spread the devotion, it is amazing how new homes and several lives were touched and hopefully changed for the better year after year

Community outreach...

We believe that the Virgin Mary touches and wants to use us in helping her less fortunate children. One of the organizers of the Miraculous Medal Blacktown, Donna Ponce has been blessed with strong desire to help the needy in Mindoro, Philippines. Since 2010, about six outreach activities have been conducted already. Food, school supplies, used clothing and others were shared during the outreach. In 2019, a medical mission is being planned. While members provide voluntary contribution (cash and in kind), it's the huge sacrifices of Donna and her family made the outreach possible.

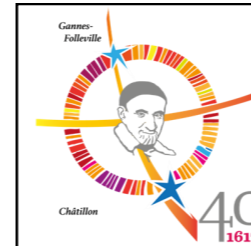

We will be utilising this money for the benefits of the poor., especially the poor people who have been affected with the recent ochi cyclone in Kerala and the Kanyakumari side. Many fishermen went to sea for the fishing and never returned till today. More than 900 missing and nearly 300 bodies have been found so far. Due to that many families livelihood is gone into the sea and many mothers and children left without work and money. So together with church authorities we are helping them in many ways such as repairing of the houses, food materials, clothes, new fishing nets, etc. Dear Sr Marie, thank you for sending the money and when it is credited to our bank account I will let you know about it. So, once again I wish you all the best in your dedicated and faithful service to the church and to others.
